# The Story of How a Typical Catholic Parish Became an International Model



## MSGR. THOMAS MCGREAD

- ◆ Renowned stewardship pioneer
- ◆ Former pastor of St. Francis of Assisi in Wichita, Kansas
- ◆ Longtime Advisor to Catholic Stewardship Consultants until his passing in April 2013

The late Msgr. Thomas McGread is often called the “Father of Stewardship.” At this one-of-a-kind conference, we share the remarkable story of how stewardship transformed Msgr. McGread’s parish — St. Francis of Assisi in Wichita — and how it has impacted other parishes across the country.

This conference, for both clergy and lay leaders, will provide a setting for you to discover how to teach your parishioners to become better Christian stewards. Come see where it all began.

Beginning in the 1960s, Msgr. McGread built one of the most vibrant parishes in the country by teaching parishioners how to use their personal gifts, or what he called “time, talent, and treasure.”

Msgr. McGread was influential in the drafting of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops’ (USCCB) pastoral letter, *Stewardship: A Disciple’s Response*, which adopted his terminology and theological vision. Msgr. McGread’s approach to stewardship was that it is a spiritual, biblically-based principle that begins with conversion of heart and translates into a lifestyle of service.

His message was so compelling that he was invited to speak at parishes and dioceses across the country, and he also was the keynote speaker at several ICSC conferences. In addition, Msgr. McGread was a part of our team at Catholic Stewardship Consultants from 2002 up until his passing in April 2013.

While Msgr. McGread is no longer with us in body, he remains with us in spirit, and his stewardship message lives on. Conference attendees will have the opportunity to view one of his presentations via giant-screen video.

## **Rev. Mr. Don McArdle**

*CEO, Catholic Stewardship Consultants, Inc.; Deacon, St. Mary on the Hill, Augusta, Georgia*

Deacon Don McArdle and his wife Pat have been married for 45 years; they have nine children and 22 grandchildren, and are members of St. Mary on the Hill, a total stewardship parish in Augusta, Ga. Deacon Don has been a CPA since 1970 and has served as a deacon in the Diocese of Savannah since 1979. For the past 20 years, Deacon Don has worked closely with parishes from across the country on all aspects of developing stewardship as a way of life. Deacon Don is the author of the book, *Grateful and Giving: How Msgr. Thomas McGread's Stewardship Message Has Impacted Catholic Parishes Throughout the Country*. The book explains the practical spirituality of stewardship, how Msgr. McGread successfully developed that spirituality at St. Francis of Assisi in Wichita, and shares the success stories of other parishes who followed the model laid out by Msgr. McGread.



## **Rev. John Lanzrath** — *Pastor, St. John, Clonmel, Kansas; Vicar for Priests, Diocese of Wichita, Kansas*

A native of Wichita, Kan., Fr. John Lanzrath earned a degree in mathematics and worked as a civilian in military intelligence at Boeing Military Airplane Company before resigning to enter the seminary. He studied at Mount St. Mary's Seminary in Emmitsburg, Md., and later at Gregorian University in Rome. He has served the Diocese of Wichita in many capacities since his ordination in 1988 – associate pastor, Vice-Chancellor, Moderator of the Curia, Director of the Spiritual Life Center, Director of Stewardship, and as Chancellor of the Diocese. Fr. John worked closely with Msgr. McGread in spreading the message of stewardship throughout the diocese and across the nation. In addition, Fr. John was instrumental in the development of their diocesan manual, *The Pillars of Parish Stewardship*.



## **Ms. Kathleen Whalen** — *Director of Stewardship and Ministry, Sacred Heart of Jesus Catholic Church, Shawnee, Kansas*

Kathleen Whalen began working at Sacred Heart of Jesus, Shawnee, Kan., in November 2009. She earned a Bachelor of Arts in Communications and a Masters in Adult Education from University of Missouri. Over the past seven years, Kathleen has worked to instill and foster stewardship as a way of life at Sacred Heart of Jesus – she continues to form, motivate and cultivate within parishioners the desire to live discipleship grounded in the spirituality of stewardship each day. Kathleen also provides staff support to the Sacred Heart Stewardship Council and helps direct 51 ministries, with efforts that are consistent and sustainable to the parish's mission. In addition, she worked for 25 years in non-profit and association management organizations, developing and supporting board structures, strategic planning, communications and fundraising.



## **Mr. Eric McArdle** — *President, Catholic Stewardship Consultants*

Eric McArdle is the President and co-founder of CSC. For nearly 20 years, Eric has worked with hundreds of parishes across the country on every aspect of stewardship development. ## **Rev. Gary Kastl** — *Pastor, St. Anne, Broken Arrow, Oklahoma*

Fr. Gary Kastl was ordained in 2007 for the Diocese of Tulsa. Since that time, Fr. Kastl has served the diocese in several leadership capacities including the Chair of the Priestly Life and Ministry Committee, the Director for Continuing Education and the Diocesan Clergy, and the Coordinator of Priests' Retreats and Days of Recollection. In addition, he has worked for the Catholic Leadership Institute as the Ministry Development Manager, helping to implement their programs for ongoing priestly leadership formation in dioceses across the country. He is currently a Leadership Consultant for CLI. Stewardship has been an integral part of Fr. Kastl's life, and he has been very successful in developing stewardship as a way of life in three different parishes, including his current assignment as pastor of St. Anne in Broken Arrow, Okla.



## **Rev. Stephen Macedo** — *Pastor, Church of the Annunciation, Kamuela, Hawaii*

Fr. Stephen Macedo was born and raised on a dairy and almond ranch in the central valley of California. He received a Bachelors of Science degree from California Polytechnic State University San Luis Obispo double majoring in Dairy Science and Fruit Science. He completed the Pre-Theology program at St. Joseph's College Seminary in Mountain View, Calif., then completed the Masters of Divinity Program at St. Patrick's Seminary in Menlo Park, Calif. Fr. Steve has been a priest of the Diocese of Honolulu for 24 years, and currently is pastor of Church of the Annunciation in Kamuela, Hawaii, on the Big Island, and also has one mission church. He currently serves on the Presbyteral Council, the Retired Priest Committee, and the Diocesan Liturgy Committee. He has been living stewardship since ordained, and his parish embraced stewardship as a way of life two years ago.



## **Rev. Konelio (Lio) Faletoi** — *Pastor, St. Michael, Kailua Kona, Hawaii*

Fr. Konelio (Lio) Faletoi was born and raised on a Central Oahu pineapple plantation. He received a Bachelor of Arts in humanities from St. Joseph's College Seminary in Mountain View, Calif. He completed the Masters of Divinity program at St. Patrick's Seminary in Menlo Park Calif. He was ordained a priest for the Diocese of Honolulu 25 years ago. Fr. Lio has served as a pastor and oversaw the building of two churches, and currently serves as the President of the Presbyteral Council, Vicar for West Hawaii Island Vicariate, and as pastor of St. Michael's Catholic Church in Kailua Kona, Hawaii, while also serving two mission churches. His parish has been living the stewardship spirituality for over two years.



## **Rev. James R. Golka** — *Pastor, Cathedral of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Grand Island, Nebraska*

Sharing has been part of Fr. Jim Golka's life from the start, as he grew up in Grand Island, Neb., in a family of 10 children. Sharing continued to be central in his life, as he spent the year after college as a volunteer on the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation in South Dakota before heading to seminary. Ordained for the Diocese of Grand Island in 1994, Fr. Jim has served as an associate pastor and pastor, becoming pastor of St. Patrick's in 2006. That same year, St. Patrick's made a commitment to become a stewardship parish and for the past decade the parish has continued to grow in discipleship through stewardship. He is beginning to implement stewardship as a way of life at his new assignment as pastor of the Cathedral of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

# Conference Information

**DATE** The conference will be held over two days, April 26-27, 2017. It is scheduled during the middle of the week so that all participants can arrive Tuesday evening and depart Thursday afternoon.

**LOCATION** The conference will be held at the Spiritual Life Center of the Diocese of Wichita. This is a modern retreat and conference center where you will see stewardship in action during your visit.

**REGISTRATION** The registration fee for the Msgr. McGread Stewardship Conference for Clergy and Lay Leaders is \$350. This includes all sessions, and breakfast, lunch and dinner. You will also receive a high-quality DVD of Msgr. McGread explaining the key components of building stewardship — ideal for viewing with your Pastoral Council or other leadership groups.



**After you register for the conference, you must make separate arrangements for your overnight accommodations. There are two choices:**

**SPIRITUAL LIFE CENTER** This is a modern retreat center where you can relax with no distractions. During your stay at the Spiritual Life Center, you will experience stewardship at work when spending time in a chapel reserved for quiet reflection and personal prayer, when simply viewing the beautiful flower gardens planted and tended by volunteers, or when being graciously served by volunteers and staff. They offer private bedrooms, individually climate-controlled, with private bathroom, shower and vanity, and no TVs or in-room WiFi access (WiFi is available in the lobby and conference rooms). There are comfortable lounge areas adjacent to all bedroom corridors offering a welcoming place to relax and engage in quiet fellowship with other retreat participants. There are 60 rooms that can be reserved on a first-come, first-served basis. The cost is \$54 per person per night for single occupancy, and \$44.00 per person per night for double occupancy.


